^{*}Officially the BSA uniform is shirt, pants, socks, and belt. However, Troop 12's position is that you wear as much of the uniform as you have. It is expected that the uniform be worn properly, (shirt tucked in, etc.).

Recommend packing everything in a plastic tote with a lid which will fit underneath the camp cot. Package each day's clothes in an individual plastic ziplock bag for convenience.
